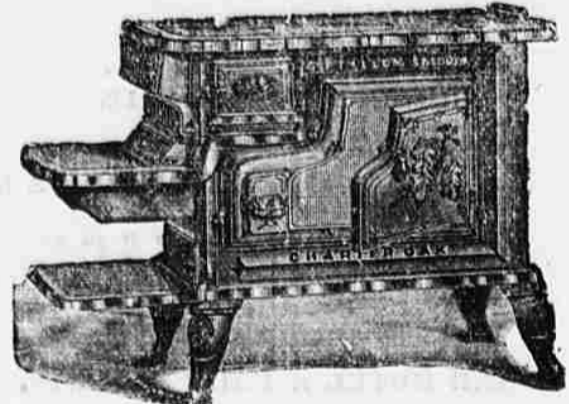

Latest Foreign News.

Sofia, Sept. 20.—The overflow of the Maritza river was attended by great loss of life. Fully 100 persons were drowned, and at Mostapha 100 Turkish soldiers perished in the flood.

Paris, Sept. 20.—Eighty tulle manufacturers at Calais locked out 5000 employes for demanding higher wages.

Cape of Good Hope, Sept. 20.—The Cape of Good Hope Bank has suspended today.

London, Sept. 20.—Col. Jas. Pepper, a Kentuckian, compelled the night clerk at the Hotel Metropole, London, to apologise, on his knees at the point of a pistol, for insults to American guests.

Spizza, Sept. 20.—The ironclad Sardegna, the largest vessel in the Italian Navy, was launched today.

Washington, Sept. 20.—The Senate today passed a bill to provide that thirty port lights for the use and conveniences of navigation shall be established along navigable channels of the Suohomish, Skagit, Norksack, rivers, the Sacouner slough and along such other channels of Puget Sound and the rivers tributary thereto in the state of Washington as may be necessary for the requirements of commerce.

The Apathes Indians are on the warpath in New Mexico. Troops have been ordered out.

New York, Sept. 20.—The statue of Horace Greeley at the Tribune building entrance was unveiled today by Miss Gabrielle Greeley in the presence of a vast crowd.

Chauncey M. Depew made the chief speech.

The Caibarien left San Francisco bound for Santa Rosalia with a cargo of general merchandise shipped by A. Carpentier. After discharging her cargo she loaded with ballast and sailed for Altata, where she expected to take on a cargo of woods for New York.

On the 2d inst. Altata was sighted. The vessel passed safely over the bar. Subsequently the winds which had been steady all day ceased to blow, and the bark was becalmed.

She dropped anchor and the strong tide swung her inshore. She struck on the beach, and became for all purposes a total wreck. She laid there until the 10th inst., when a survey was held.

The hull brought \$305, the stores \$112, and the incidentals made the total sum obtained \$440. It is believed that the Caibarien was not insured directly in any of the local companies.

It is known that she was insured in the East. The Caibarien is entitled to mention as being one of the oldest vessels from this coast.

She was built over forty years ago, and was in the Australian register at one time. Subsequently she was placed in the American register and the packet service between Honolulu and New York.

Sydney, September 20.—Colonial Treasurer McMillan has resigned. He takes the step because the Premier expresses disapproval of his promise to a deputation of merchants that the Government would take extreme measures to protect non-union men against strikers.

Anxiety is felt for the ship Henry Buck, which was spoken at sea in distress by the bark W. B. Godfrey. She has not been heard of since, and is long overdue at San Francisco.

The pilot boat Gov. Moody was wrecked off Cape Disappointment, Sept. 20. The cook was drowned.

The bktn. S. G. Wilder arrived at San Francisco, Sept. 20, 33 days from Honolulu.
