On the other hand, the President's message demonstrates, from the record of this Hawaiian matter, that the repre sentatives of the previous Administration committed, without the authority of Congress, an act of war by which a feeble and friendly Government was robbed of it- authority and sovereignty, and the that same ministration was about to stain the national honor by making our Government the beneficiary of that unconstitutional, unlawful, and alto gether infamous wrong. It is now made as clear as the light of day that a providential change of Ad ministration was the only thing which prevented the people of the United States, without their con-sent, being placed in the position of vandals and robbers who had crushed the national life of a weak but kindly ueighbor and then appropriated the dead nation's property. As

When our Minister recognized the Provisional Government, the only basis upon which it rested was the fact that the Committee of Publie Safety had in the manner above stated declared it to exist. It was neither a Government de facto nor de jure. * * * Nevertheless this wrongful recognition by our the Minister placed the Government of the Queen in a position of most perilous perplexity. On one hand, she had possession of the palace, of the barracks and of the police station, and at her command at least 500 fully armed men and several pieces of artillery; indeed, the whole military force of her kingdom was on her side and at her disposal, while the Committee of Safety by actual search had discovered that there were but very few arms in Honolulu not in the service of the Government. In this state of things, if the Queen could have dealt with the insurgents alone, her course would have been plain and the re-sult unmistakable; but the United States had allied itself with her enemies, had recognized them as the true Government of Hawaii, and had put her in a position of opposition to lawful authority. She knew she could not withstand the power of the United States, but she believed she might safely trust to its jus-
