NEWS ALONG THE WHARVES

THE STEAMER KAUAU COMES IN FROM MAKAWALI

The Steamer Kaia to Leeward Oahu--Schooner Ka Mol Out--Movements of Vessels.

The schooner Ka Mol left this afternoon for Hamakua.

The schooner William Bowen will load Newcastle coal for Honolulu.

The bark S C Allen and barkentine S N Castle are loading off the steamer W G Hall.

The steamer Kaia took a small freight out this morning for Waianae, Waiakua and Mokuia.

The embargo on the departure of passengers from this port by order of the health authorities is still on.

The steamer W G Hall brought in 4322 bags of sugar and 27 passengers from Hawaii late yesterday afternoon.

Pahala plantation expects to turn off 7000 tons of sugar next season, and in 1897 prospects are bright for an output of 10,000 tons.

The steamer Kilauea Hou left at noon today with a light cargo for Ooaka and Kukaia, having waited in vain for the quarantined laborers off the Belgic.

The bark C D Bryant expects to leave for San Francisco next Sunday. Captain Jacobsen will take on ballast, as he does not care for a long wait in port for a sugar cargo.

The steamer J A Cummins arrived from Waimanalo this morning with a cargo of 1125 bags of Hecla sugar, and 200 bags of rice which was unloaded at Oceanic wharf. She returns tomorrow morning.

The steamer Kaula arrived this morning empty from Makawali, and will leave in a few days with 300 tons of coal for that plantation. The carrying capacity of this new steamer is about 450 tons of bulk coal, or 7500 sacks sugar.
