**INCENDIARISM ON THE ISLAND OF MOLOKAI.**

Physician Recommended From Chicago—Hawaiian Silver Returned From Yokohama—Dr. Peterson Takes Waianae.

There was a special meeting of the Board of Health yesterday afternoon. Present: J. T. Waterhouse, president; Drs. Emerson, Day and Wood, T. F. Lansing and David Keliipio, members; H. E. Cooper, Minister of Foreign Affairs; Charles Wilcox, secretary to the Board.

Dr. Day reported that the fumigating plant was not ready, and the freight of the steamer Mount Lebanon, he suggested, should be fumigated in a close room.

Executive officer C. B. Reynolds was instructed to carry out the suggestion.

The reports of W. T. Monsarrat V. S., on cattle, etc., were read. Liver fluke is still prevalent among cattle.

Dr. Peterson by letter accepted charge of Waianae in addition to Ewa.

Superintendent R. W. Meyer's usual report on the Leprosy Settlement contained some startling intelligence. The house of H. K. Hitchcock at Kaluaaha, leased to E. Thrimble, deputy sheriff, had been maliciously burned. Dr. Oliver's wife's residence had been broken into and some things stolen. Mr. Meyer complained that the policemen of the settlement were usually away when wanted, and their labors seemed to consist chiefly in drawing their salaries.

A petition from lepers to substitute Harry Treadway for Mr. Hutchins as resident superintendent was received, but as such petitions are an old story no action was taken upon it.

Dr. Charles D. Center was recommended from Chicago for any vacant post as Government physician.

The President read a memorandum from the Japanese Specie Bank, reporting the return from Yokohama by the steamer Mount Lebanon of \$760 in Hawaiian silver. It was for the Board to decide if it should be boiled to destroy any possible infection; it was decided to boil the filthy lucre.

A letter was read from Attorney-General W. O. Smith, permanent president ex-officio of the Board, now in New Zealand. It recommended the issuance of a circular letter of instructions to physicians. The Board voted to have such letter issued.

Mr. Keliipio presented a report of the number and different varieties of fish that had passed inspection at the fish market.

Prior to adjourning the Board held a short executive session.

**SENTENCE OF A PREACHER.**

**Life Imprisonment for Killing His Wife**

DANVILLE (Ind.), November 5.—At 11:30 o'clock today Rev. William E. Hinshaw, convicted of wife murder, was brought into court to be sentenced. Judge Hadley asked whether he had anything to say before sentence was pronounced, and the convicted preacher replied in a long speech, in which he declared himself innocent. Although the jury had found him guilty, he said he cherished no resentment against them or any man.

In conclusion, he said: "I desire it to go upon the records of this court, with my hands upon its sacred shrine, my face uplifted to heaven, that their verdict is false. I am not guilty. Before I go to my living burial, I wish to thank the Court for his kindness at all times.

"I commend you all to God, and will meet you at the judgment bar, where I will have another trial and pass into happiness. I go to my living burial, and as I go I salute you. I am now ready for what may come."

Judge Hadley then sentenced Hinshaw to life imprisonment.


