#### UNITED STATES.

The Appellate division of the Supreme Court of New York has given a dicision affirming the order of the lower court, which gave a decision in favor of Laidlaw again-t Russell Suge for \$40,000 damages and costs amounting to about \$3000. Laidlaw is the man who was used as a shield by Sage when a dynamite bomb exploded in his office.

Dr. Wilton W. McCarthy, demonstrator of anatomy in Drake Medical College, was indicted by the grand jury at Des Moines, lows, for receiving stolen goods. It is alleged that he bought corpses stolen from graves.

Representative Loud of California, in explaining the appropriation for the postal service, amounting to \$91,943,757, which is nearly three million dollars less than the estimates, while \$2,397,-760 more than the bill for the current fiscal year, gave it as his opinion that unless conditions in 136-tf the Postoffice Department and postal service were changed by Congress the annual deficiency 85,000,000 in 1888 to \$10,000,000 in 1890, would increase in the future even more rapidly.
