ing sugar cane. So far as the work and the climate are concerned I know they can do it—only the socialistic features of it can cause a failure. One thing is sure, and that is that the Ewa Plantation Co. is sincere in its part and will do everything possible to make it a complete success." Alluding to his leaving Ewa to take charge of Spreckelsville, Mr. Lowrie makes these remarks: "As this will, in all probabilities, be the last annual report I shall make to you, I wish to say, that in leaving the plantation it is a source of great pleasure to me to know that our bonded debt is all paid, that we are free from debt, and that we have practically a new pumping plant, new steam plows, new locomotive, six miles new railroad, a new thirty-inch pipe line, a new Heidler pump and boiler at the mills, besides a payment on the new pump for No. 1, and that the mill improvements for the next year are the only big expense the company will be put to for several years to come." Notwithstanding, he says, it is with deep regret he severs his connection with the plantation, and he tenders his most sincere thanks to E. D. Tenney the secretary, the directors and the heads of departments, for their kind help and assistance to him during the past nine years. He bespeaks for his successor, Mr. Renton, "that he may be treated with like generosity and kindness by all, and if so surely his lot will be cast in pleasant places."
