Steamers Aorangi, Warrimoo, and Miowera run between Victoria and the Colonies; Alameda, Mariposa, and Moana between San Francisco and the Colonies; Nippon Maru, Rio de Janeiro, China, Doric, Copitic, America Maru, Gaelic, and Hongkong Maru between San Francisco and Japan and China; Australia between San Francisco and Honolulu only.
