## ABOUT THE CEMETERY

EDITOR EVENING BULLETIN:—  
As you are desirous of hearing  
from all in this matter of "new  
cemetery site," I would say I am  
positively averse to the proposed  
Punchbowl site for the same rea-  
sons expressed by the Honolulu  
physicians who have been kind  
enough to give their honest opin-  
ions in this matter.

Why should we appropriate the  
most desirable portion of the city  
for the dead, while the living are  
compelled to endure low, damp  
and fever stricken localities. Why  
not secure some of the flat or low  
land near sea level? There are  
vast areas of this kind of land to  
be seen along the railroad track  
on the way to Ewa, and no doubt  
arrangement could be made with  
the railroad company whereby  
funeral parties could be taken to  
and from a cemetery at less than  
regular passenger rates, and more  
especially if a rule could be  
adopted whereby the railroad  
could be allowed to select one  
particular hour for leaving the  
depot each day instead of expect-  
ing the railroad company to re-  
main liable for a call at any min-  
ute. Perhaps 3 o'clock or a little  
earlier or later each day would be  
a good time for the railroad com-  
pany to make available to funeral  
parties.

I say parties, for many times  
there would be two and perhaps  
three funerals and it would be no  
more expense for the railroad  
company to take two or three  
than one, comparatively—and this  
is why railroad company could be  
prevailed upon to submit most  
favorable terms. At all events,  
the living should have some con-  
sideration. The old dilapidated  
grave yards in Honolulu are a  
disgrace and eye sore and are only  
tolerated because some influen-  
tial person has not taken the mat-  
ter in hand, for when they do  
they will have lots of backing—the  
old grave yards would have  
few champions.

A crematory would be of the  
greatest benefit. There are very  
many people in favor of it now  
and once it became a fact the pre-  
judice would soon begin to be  
dispelled. If we had been accus-  
tomed to cremation for ages as we  
have been to burial, I venture to  
say, it would be even harder to  
persuade a parent to have one of  
their beloved buried deep in the  
damp ground—there to be sub-  
ject to the natural decay, in-  
stead of having the body re-  
duced to clean ashes, in a well ap-  
pointed crematory, and those  
ashes placed in a silver or gold  
urn or casket.

If a crematory were started it  
seems right that hundreds and hun-  
dreds of unknown and unclaim-  
ed remains filling many of these  
old graveyards should be taken  
up and cremated, thereby remov-  
ing many hideous little mounds  
that in reality have no mean-  
ing.

The incorporators of the crema-  
tory will be the much envied ones  
of these days and will be entitled  
to all public patronage and praise.
