

# KAIMUKI.

The bark Himalaya is loading sugar at the Oceanic wharf.

There is no sign of the Nippon Maru as the BULLETIN goes to press.

Steamer Maui is undergoing a complete overhauling on the Marine railway.

Nearly fifteen thousand bags of sugar for San Francisco went on the Mobicau.

General merchandise made up the cargo of the bark R P Ritbet which arrived last night. She is 10 days from Frisco.

There are eighteen ships due in this port during the next two weeks. Seven American vessels, seven British, two German and two Hawaiian.

The U S A transport Sheridan is due here tonight or tomorrow from San Francisco. On her arrival she will expedite coal at the Oceanic wharf and be despatched to Manila.

The American ship John C Potter arrived in this port yesterday afternoon and dropped her anchor out in the stream. She brings a large cargo of Puckettfield coal and is out almost three and a half months from Newcastle having left that port on the 4th of March. The length of the voyage is due to the fact that the Potter experienced bad weather almost continuously from the time she left Australia.

As the BULLETIN goes to press the American schooner H D Bendixon, Captain Olsen, clears for San Francisco with 18,339 bags of sugar as follows: 2000 bags of Wailuku, 3952 of H A Co's and 3595 of M S Co's sugar shipped by C Brewer & Co and consigned to Welch & Co; 6320 bags of Ewa sugar from Castle & Cooke to Welch & Co and 2472 bags of P S M sugar from F A Schaefer & Co to Williams, Diamond & Co. The cargo is valued at \$86,537.
