A communication from Prof. Scott of Honolulu, Hawaii, referring to some school property secured by a long lease from a native a few years ago, was referred to Secretary Rodgers for investigation.

Prof. Alexander reported that a site for the Reform School had not yet been fixed upon, although the committee consisting of Alexander, Superintendent Needham and himself had investigated several sites.

Up to time of going to press nineteen deserters from various vessels in port have been rounded up by Officers Harry Evans, Jim Kapihe and others.
