BRITISH REPULSE ATTACK

London, Nov. 8.—The War Office has received the following dispatches from General Buller, dated Cape Town, Wednesday, Nov. 8, 11:50 p. m.:

"Colonel Kekewich telegraphs from Kimberley, Nov. 8, that all is well there and there has been no serious attack as yet. A slight bombardment did no damage. Information from Mafeking shows that place was safe October 27. Colonel Plummer had a successful engagement near Fort Tuli, October 27.

"General White reports by pigeon-post that the wounded and some civilians from Ladysmith have been removed four miles down the railway by an arrangement with General Joubert to a neutral place, to save them from the bombardment. Ninety-nine wounded from Dundee have been sent in under a flag of truce. They are all doing well, including the following officers:

"Colonel C. C. Heckett, Major F. Hammersley, Captain F. L. Adam, Lieut. McLachlin, Major Boulbee, Captain Dibley, Lieut. C. N. Perrau, Lieut. C. A. Wortham, Major W. Davidson and Lieut. D. E. Welder.

"The bombardment was discontinued November 4 and 5 and it is expected to recommence Nov. 6."

The absence of stirring war news and the rehabilitation in the estimates of the public of General White, who, since his reverse at Nicholson's Nek, certainly appears to have used his central position to successfully strike at different points of the circle of investment, thus restoring confidence in his ability to hold the Boers in check, have permitted public attention to momentarily revert to the political features of South Africa, and conflict is confidently predicted in some quarters.

Sorties by the British.

London, Nov. 7.—Tonight's welcome dispatches from the front have rent the veil of gloom enveloping Ladysmith, showing the British garrison not merely standing on the dogged defensive, but executing a series of brilliant sorties. Accounts from different sources agree that the laconic official description of Thursday's engagement as "an effective shelling of the Boer laager" was unduly modest. It appears that General Sir George Stewart White sent a strong force of cavalry and infantry to attack the Boers at Tatham's farm, about ten miles to the northwest, near Bester's, and apparently achieved a surprise, the Boers being caught on the open veldt and cut to pieces, and their camp captured. Encouraged by this success, General White decided to risk an even more important engagement on the following day, which was again justified by success.

Ladysmith had been isolated and a Boer force had intercepted the railway between Ladysmith and Colenso. This force on Friday had descended upon Colenso, and as shown by the dispatches from Estcourt had compelled a hurried abandonment of Colenso, and a retirement of the British to Estcourt. General White had ascertained that the Boers were attacking Colenso but he was not aware of the British reinforcement. He had determined, therefore, to attack the Boers in the rear, thus hoping to achieve the double object of drawing off an attempt upon the weak garrison of Colenso and possibly of reopening communication southward.

The Boers had advanced southward until they had occupied the hills north of Tugela river and dominating Colenso on the other side of the stream. The hills slope to a plain that reaches to the banks of the Tugela.

General White's division caught the Boers in the rear and after the hills had been shelled the British infantry stormed the position. Meanwhile the British cavalry swept round the hills, and as the retreating enemy descended into the plains with British bayonets behind and the river in front of them, they were charged by the cavalry and seem to have perished almost to a man. The British then returned to Ladysmith without coming into touch with the Colenso garrison, which had retired to Estcourt.

BOERS ABOUT KIMBERLEY.

Orange River, Cape Colony, Monday, Nov. 6.—The Boers investing Kimberley have been reinforced by 2000 men and have succeeded in corraling about 5000 pounds worth of stock belonging to Kimberley merchants, which was intended for the sustenance of the town.
