SUGAR AS ARMY FOOD.

New York, Nov. 25.—A Sun cable from London, says: Germany has just completed elaborate experiments with sugar as food for troops. The object was to test the advantages of sugar diet in cases where great exertions were to be made within a brief period. According to reports of experiments in various army corps, a favorable result has been secured. Professor Pfuhl, head of the physiological laboratory of the army, states that it has been proved that sugar diet increases muscular power in a comparatively short time, considerably shorter than does the white of an egg.
