Big Ship Roanoke.

The Roanoke, the largest American sailing ship afloat, came into the harbor yesterday morning, 156 days from Baltimore, with a cargo of 4900 tons of coal. The Roanoke is now in the stream, but will soon go alongside the Rosefield bunkers to discharge. The vessel is of over 3400 tons register and is commanded by Captain Amesbury. He reports that the Roanoke sailed from Baltimore on March 13th, reaching Staten Island on May 17th. Twenty days were required to go from there to Cape Hen, a distance of 250 miles, when heavy gales from the west, with snow and sleet, were experienced and the ship was twice driven back. The Roanoke was thirty-four days in sailing from 50 degrees to 50 degrees, and the equator in the Pacific was crossed on July 16th in longitude 112 deg. A gale was encountered in latitude 16 deg. north, longitude 120 deg. west, lasting three days, with high cross seas, the wind being of nearly hurricane force. The remainder of the trip was made without noteworthy incident.—Chronicle.
