RUSSIAN REVOLUTION SAID TO BE A MYTH

New York, June 1.—A dispatch to the Herald from London says: Gen. G. B. Williams, who has been stopping at the Hotel Cecil, emphatically denies the reports that have been circulated to the effect that Russia is on the verge of revolution. In an interview he says: "To judge by the reports in the English papers, one would imagine that Russia was a hotbed of sedition, just quivering on the brink of revolution. Now, I have visited that country periodically for many years past and have had an opportunity to see, perhaps, more than the visitor could see, and to study the conditions of the country in a way that one can only do by intimate acquaintances. The country is as peaceful as any in the world."

CANADA'S CHALLENGER

Toronto, Ont., June 1.—The following particulars of Canada's cup challenger have been received from the owners: The Invader, which was launched last Monday at Oakville, near Toronto, has an over-all length of 49 feet and 6 inches, with a water-line of 28 feet, a beam of 9 feet 4 inches, and a draught of 6 feet and 6 inches. Her displacement is 6100 pounds. The mast is 42 feet long, the main boom 38 feet, hoist 31 feet, horn 6 feet and 6 inches, base of forward triangle 20 feet and hoist of jib 28 feet.
