At the meetings of the stockholders of Honolulu and Pacific Sugar, held this morning, it was decided to extend the sugar contracts with the Eastern refiners for two years.

Mr. Ballentyne, manager of the Rapid Transit Company, was personally in charge of the cars that took the Kamehameha students to Judd street from the schools this morning.

On Sunday morning, Bishop Willis will hold a confirmation service in St. Andrew's Cathedral at 5:30 o'clock. There will be a dozen candidates presented by Rev. Alex. Mackintosh.

Pacific Heights will have the privilege of a band concert for the first time on Saturday afternoon, when the government band will play from 3 to 5 o'clock.

McCabe, Hamilton & Renny are putting the machinery aboard and a large gang of men was at work this morning rigging shears for the lifting of the heavy weight. The boiler weighs ten tons and the engine about as much.
