FIELD DAY PLANS

At the meeting of the Boys' Brigade field day committee the other night, the following were finally settled on as officers of the day: Referee, Fred Young; field marshal, Chas. Chillingworth; clerk of the course, James L. Torbert; starter, W. H. Babbitt; official scorer, D. Lloyd Conkling; official announcer, A. A. Wilder; field judges, Albert Judd, Percy Benson and C. F. Schermerhorn; judges at finish, Lieut. Behr, W. D. Anderson and Percy Morse; timekeepers, Jack Atkinson, F. J. Kruger and Albert Waterhouse.

Mr. Cheek reported that he had made arrangements for the necessary apparatus for the events. He had seen Mr. Gere of the Boys' Brigade trade school and had arranged with him for the high jumps and pole vault standards and also for one course of hurdles. He had arranged to borrow the three or four other necessary courses of hurdles from Punahou.
