MOLOKAN CONTRACT FOR KAPAA FINNALLY ARRANGED

The following cablegrams have been received announcing the satisfactory conclusion of the Kapaia Molokan matter:

Los Angeles, Jan. 23.—To George R. Carter, Governor of Hawaii: Molokan contract signed. Leave immediately. PRATT.

Los Angeles, Jan. 23.—To James B. Castle, Honolulu: Everything satisfactory; shake! DEMONS.

Los Angeles, Jan. 23.—To James B. Castle, Honolulu: Kapaia contract signed. Return Sierra. THURSTON.

The Molokans are expected to arrive in March. Geo. P. Thielen will be sent by the steamer to make arrangements with them. They will probably come here in the Olympia, going directly to Kapaia. Castle intends to arrange for a similar settlement for Molokans at Hakalau. The plantation management there is said to favor the plan.

WORLD NEWS BY CABLE

(Associated Press Cable.)

PASSENGERS DOOMED. Victoria, B. C., Jan. 23.—The steamer Valencia, bound from San Francisco to Puget Sound, with one hundred passengers on board and a crew of thirty-five, is on the rocks ten miles east of Cape Beale. A boat's crew of six persons has arrived at Beale, and reported that the passengers and members of the crew remaining on the vessel are probably doomed. Many were drowned in endeavoring to leave the ship.

The Valencia was dispatched from San Francisco by the Pacific Coast Steamship Company on January 6th, taking the run of the City of Pueblo, which had been brought into port two days earlier in a disabled condition. The Valencia was commanded by Captain Cann. The Valencia was in Honolulu harbor several times during the Spanish war, having been in the transport service.

CLAIMING THE DEFEAT OF JOINT STATEHOOD. Washington, Jan. 23.—A caucus of the insurgent Republican members of Congress makes the claim that there are enough votes to defeat the proposition for joint statehood.

One of the greatest fights in the present session of Congress is that being made to secure the admission of Arizona and New Mexico as one state of the Union, and of Oklahoma and Indian Territory as another. The plan has the approval of Roosevelt.

PARLIAMENTARY MONARCHY. St. Petersburg, Jan. 23.—The constitutional democratic convention has declared in favor of a constitutional parliamentary monarchy.

The finances of the empire are causing great uneasiness. EIGHT-HOURS FOR PANAMA. Washington, Jan. 23.—The House of Representatives has decided that it will not abrogate the eight-hour-day provision of the Panama bill, and also that the Canal Commissioners shall not receive the proposed additional compensation.

CHINESE IN WASHINGTON. Washington, Jan. 23.—The Imperial Chinese Commissioners have arrived here.

Peking, Jan. 23.—The Dowager Empress has ordered that all the eligible princes be presented at the palace, for the purpose of choosing a successor to the Emperor.

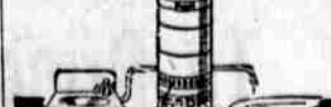
