

**Maui Aids In Relief Of 'Frisco**

Prompt action is being taken by people on Maui to help swell the relief fund for sufferers in San Francisco. At a mass meeting held Sunday plans for collecting funds were made at Wailuku, and before the meeting closed \$420 was subscribed. This information came today in the following letter received by H. P. Wood, secretary of the General Relief Committee named by the Governor:

Wailuku, Maui, T. H., April 25, 1906.  
H. P. Wood, Esq., Honolulu, Oahu.  
Dear Sir:—Your circular letter relative to funds for San Francisco sufferers received.  
On Sunday last a mass meeting of citizens was held at the armory in Wailuku for the purpose of collecting funds for the distressed people of San Francisco. Committees were appointed and before the meeting adjourned some \$420 was subscribed. We hope to forward a good donation either by tonight's mail or before the week closes. Mr. C. B. Wells was the chairman of the mass meeting, and matters

are in his hands for attention. As I understand, all collections will be forwarded to Honolulu as Maui's contribution, and will probably go forward with funds collected in Oahu to be known as Hawaii's contribution.
