## No Master Found AS YET For Morning Star

Who will go in command of the Morning Star when she sails from this port again for Seattle is still an unsettled question. No one has yet been found to take charge of her. Captain Garland will not go out in her again. W. W. Hall says that Captain Garland did not wish to go last time, but was urged to do so and finally consented. It was rumored that Captain Piliz might be the man, but Captain Piliz states emphatically that this is not so, that he has no intention of going and that the position was never offered to him, anyway.

There is also trouble in getting a mate. The man who sailed the first time as mate will not be allowed to do so this time, and has severed his connection with the vessel. His certificate expired nearly two years ago, and he has never had it renewed. The regulations permit a man, who is adjudged competent, to sail as mate of a vessel if the captain states under oath that he is unable to get a duly qualified mate, and it was under these conditions that the mate sailed the first time.

But on account of recent developments and some internal dissensions, it is said, he will not go as mate this time. He has been trying to get permission to go out as master of the vessel, but this Collector Stackable refuses to grant.

The Morning Star has been undergoing repairs since she came back, and Mr. Hall expresses the belief that she is in condition to make the voyage to Seattle. When she will sail again is not yet decided. It will probably be some time next week, the agent says if the matter of a commander and crew can be settled by that time.
