

The Territory of Hawaii was officiarly represented by Admiral Beckley during the call of the Japanese training sleps at the port of Hilo. That means that the honors were done in proper style.

On Tuesday last Admiral Beckley received the following wireless telegram, a copy of which with the Territorial official seal and the Secretary's official signature attached, he now highly prizes:

Honolulu, Feb. 26, 1907. Admiral Beckley, Hilo.

Admiral Tomioka and squadron will arrive Hilo Wednesday p. m. Please call. Any courtesies you may be able to show will be greatly appreciated. ATKINSON.

The coldest it has been was 54 below so you see the thermometer is going Old settlers claim that the present winter has been the most severe for the last twenty years. For over a month the thermometer has hung around 30 and 40 below. We are also having a coal famine on account of the mines being closed down so long last summer. Coal merchants here are selling but half a ton at a time, and this week schools are closing and we expect to close down at the office and only get out the paper at night this week. There has been so much snow that the railroads are continually getting blocked, and yesterday all passenger trains were can celled until several towns could receive a supply of coal. I tell you these things make a person think of good old Honolulu.
