At twelve o'clock noon, Monday, August 17th, 1908, at the front entrance of the Judiciary Building, Honolulu, there will be sold at public auction, under the Provisions of Part 5, Land Act 1895, (Sections 278-285 inclusive, Revised Laws of Hawaii), general leases of the following described lands:

1. The land of Holoakawala, Hamakua, Hawaii, containing an area of 1035.5 acres, a little more or less, to be used for pastoral purposes. Upset Rental, \$248.50 per annum, payable semi-annually in advance. Term of Lease, nineteen (19) years from Sept. 8, 1909.
2. The land of East Ohaia, Molokai, containing an area of 284 acres a little more or less, to be used for pastoral purposes. Upset Rental, \$25.00 per annum, payable semi-annually in advance. Term of Lease, fifteen (15) years from August 17, 1908.

LARGE DECREASE IN DEATH RATE

Registrar Lawrence Makes An Interesting Report

Nineteen deaths less during the month of July, 1908, than there were during the same month last year, is the encouraging report which has come from the Board of Health through Registrar Lawrence. Consumption still reaps its deadly harvest, for there were 82 deaths from this disease during the past month. The following is the summary of the report:

Population of Honolulu, official census 1900, 39,306. Mortality for month of July, 1908: Males, 28; females, 23; total, 51. Annual death rate per 1000 of population, 16.18. Non-resident, 9; deaths investigated, 6; coroner's inquest, 3; stillbirths (not included in the mortality), 7; births reported, 99; marriages reported, 81. The total number of deaths for the month of July, 1908, were 53, a decrease of nineteen compared with the corresponding month of 1907.

HILO AND FLEET

HILO, Hawaii, Aug. 4.—Since the failure of Hilo to secure the presence here of all or any portion of the Atlantic Fleet, it has been suggested by many that some effort be made to have a part at least of the Pacific Fleet sent to this port, or, at any rate, within sight of it, during the stay of nearly three weeks which it has been announced that the Fleet will spend in Hawaiian waters in August or September.

It was also suggested that the committee appointed to attend to the Pacific Fleet matter should retain their organization and proceed with the work to be done in connection with the Pacific Fleet; but inasmuch as more or less dissatisfaction has been expressed regarding the method by which the committee was chosen, and some apparently have felt slighted that they were overlooked in the naming of its members, and further because the committee felt that they had no power to act in any other matter except the one for which they were specifically appointed, a meeting was called for last Friday at Fireman's Hall for the purpose of deciding whether any action should be taken, and of appointing a new committee to carry it out.

At the appointed hour there was an enthusiastic swarm of mosquitoes in attendance optimistically awaiting the crowds which it was supposed would gather to carry out the objects of the meeting and effectually thwart any attempt on the part of Honolulu to pose as the only rendezvous of warships in the Territory.

In the course of half an hour about ten patriotic individuals had gathered and decided that Hilo did not care whether she had anything here in the way of a fleet outside the Matson line, the inter-island steamers, and the Jap fishing boats. Eventually a few more wandered in and it was decided to have a meeting anyhow. The gathering was called to order by Judge Parsons, who stated the object of the meeting. Judge Parsons was then chosen chairman of the meeting, and it was moved that a committee be appointed to ascertain public sentiment on the matter, and if there seemed to be really any popular sentiment in favor of the project that the proper steps be taken to carry it out. Otherwise it will be dropped.

Upon a general discussion of the matter, it was considered best to make application directly to Washington if anything is done at all, and it is believed from some remarks made by Secretary Garfield when he was here, that he will use his influence with the Navy Department to help us in the matter. No attempt will probably be made to get more than three or four vessels here at the most, as it would be impossible to attempt to do anything in the way of entertainment for a larger number, or arrange for transportation to the Volcano.—Hilo Tribune.
