COMMITTEE COULD MAKE NO REPORT

Kealoa Mumbles Explanation of Slowness in Iolaukaea Matter. Fruitless Conference

The report which the special committee was to have made to the Board of Supervisors fast evening on the Iolaukaea matter is yet to be made. Chairman Kealoa stated that the report was not signed, and when he was asked to get the members of his committee to sign then and there, took refuge in the position that the report would have to be gone over yet to some extent, though he did not make very clear his objections to coming out with the report, especially as he had a big bunch of papers in his pocket which looked as though they might have been the report in question.

Yesterday forenoon, there was much pow-wow about the County offices. The committee were all there, and though they had worked faithfully over the report for a long time, they were still at it yesterday afternoon—and then they didn't get through.

Chairman Huscate reminded Mr. Kealoa that the meeting of last night was held especially to receive this report, and finally extracted a promise, which amounted to "I think so," that this report will be ready for the meeting of August 26th.

Some little discussion arose over an item of \$196.25 presented by Mr. Cox for the police department, representing an expenditure in July over and above its appropriation. Mr. Cox explained that that expenditure had been made during the stay of the Fleet here; for boarding and lodging men at the police station, so that they might all be called out in case of need.

Mr. Cox also reported repairs needed on the Waikea bridge, where some of the joists are rotting away. Mr. Gere further explained that the steel ought to be painted and the bridge cleaned. Mr. Archer thought that the matter might wait a week or so, when the regular appropriations might be made to cover this item, too, but the County engineer stated that he thought the bridge dangerous, and so an appropriation of \$1,000 was made, for painting and repairing the structure.

The matter of testing the Municipal Act was brought up, through a suggestion of Mr. Fern that the County Attorney be asked for an opinion on the matter, which was elaborated by Mr. Archer into a project for a test case.

Mr. Huscate stated that he understood that the papers for a test case were already drawn by a certain political party here, and he and other members of the Board thought it no matter for the Supervisors to take up.

He assured Mr. Fern that the matter is now being looked up by the County Attorney, but had to quell Mr. Archer by saying, "You are trying to overthrow your own government, Mr. Archer. If you keep on this way you will be a revolutionist."

Mr. Harvey thought that work ought to be going forward on the widening and improving of the Diamond Head road, but Mr. Huscate explained that this would be done as soon as some other urgent jobs were off the hands of the Road Committee.

Superintendent of Public Works Marston Campbell notified the Board that the exchanges of land for the straightening of Fort street in front of the property of Joseph K. Aea had been made. Also that the Bishop Estate had agreed to extend the tenancy of the County for six months to the premises on Keawe street used as a place for the deposit of dredgings from the harbor, on condition that the County fill in the proposed extension of Kakaako street from Puncabow to Halekuauli street.

COMPILES LUMBER INDUSTRY FIGURES

Carrying on the work of the Territorial Conservation Commission, recently appointed by Governor Frear, Territorial Forester Ralph S. Homer is at present compiling statistics with regard to the lumber industry in these Islands.

Not only is Mr. Homer preparing statistics that will show the amount of timber, but also almost exclusively, that is being made into lumber here, but he is also making a list of the amount of lumber that is annually shipped into the Territory.

It is the intention of the Conservation Commission to make experiments with lumber-trees from the Coast, such as spruce, fir, and hemlock, planting them at an altitude here that would give them about the same temperature as they receive on the mainland, and if these prove successful, it is probable that Hawaii will, in the course of a few years, have transplanted-forests growing on her mountain-sides.

ODD FELLOWS PLAN FLEET ENTERTAINMENT

A committee was appointed last night to arrange for a gala entertainment of the local Odd Fellows and their brother lodge members with the Pacific Fleet, and he already has plans working that should provide for an excellent time on the night he has selected. Saturday night, September 5th, will be the occasion of the extensive entertainment planned for the brother Odd Fellows with the Pacific Fleet as well as for the relatives of the local members and the Rebekahs of Honolulu and vicinity.

It is the tentative plan at present to have all three floors of the Odd Fellows building in use on the night for the entertainment, the roof garden being the scene of a dance, cards and games on the second floor, and a children's palace of fun on the first floor. Refreshments will be served on the second floor.
