# PLANNING FOR A GIANT WAR SHIP

### Navy Considers Construction of Vessel With 14=Inch Guns

Washington, Dec. 19.-The Navy Desartment is considering the desirabily of constructing monster battlehips, bigger than anything yet built r even designed elsewhere. One plan resented by the Naval Board on Contruction calls for eight fourteen inch runs and displacement of 25,000 tons the fourteen-inch gun ship, the thickness of the turret, side and barbette armor will be greater than in he twelve-inch gun ship, giving beter protection than the latter will eaoy. Two designs have been prepared or a fourteen-inch gun ship.

There have long been serious differnces among naval experts regarding he advisability of using bigger guns than twelve-inch on account of the probability that the discharge of bigter guns would seriously rock the chip Moreover, it is known that ander some conditions the eight-inch unus, for instance, are more effective than ten-inch. The Navy Department is pretty well committed to the allbig gun-ship plan and Congress may consider it favorably when the mat er is properly presented. The speed of the new ships is intended to be from 20% to 20% knots under trial condi-
