## INTEREST IN HAWAII GREAT

Promotion Committee in Week  
Gets Inquiries from  
Many Countries.

An increasing flood of inquiries about the Islands is coming in to the Promotion Committee, according to the report made today by Secretary H. P. Wood.

Secretary Wood's report says: "Within the past week we have received inquiries for information about Hawaii from England, France, Germany, Switzerland, Ceylon, Australia, New Zealand, as well as many other letters from the mainland of the United States and Canada. The Administrator of Colonies for the Province of Madagascary, Madagascar, writes for a complete information concerning Hawaii as we may be able to send him, stating in his letter that he expects to spend some time in the Islands next year."

"Redaktion von Meyers Reisebuchern," the famous German publishing house, whose works on travel have a world-wide circulation and to which we have previously sent our matter, write us under date of October 14, as follows:

"We are preparing a second edition of our book, 'Weltreiseführer' (World's Travel Guide). This book will appear towards end of 1911. For the previous issue you gave us valuable information concerning Hawaii and you promised assistance in the future."

"Therefore we request of you again to assist us on similar lines. We would like to have first:

"1.—City maps of Honolulu, with as much text as pertains to it as is of importance to a globe-trotter, also state what such a traveler can and should see if he stops for a short time in Honolulu or Hawaii."

"No extensive information is required; just touch upon the most important features or objects in a brief outline or correct such printed matter as you may have on hand that will answer this purpose."
