"It was at Hankow that we were brought into close contact with the work of the missionaries, and I must confess that my opinion took a decided change from my former unfavorable ideas, to a great appreciation of the work that there people are doing in China. The Biblical teaching of these missionaries is by far the smallest feature of their work, their time being taken up with the practicalleducation of the Chinese students, who will in turn become valuable teachers of modern methods and of what the Chinese are most in need of system.
