Cable News

ARMY ENGINEERS ORDERED HERE

(Associated Press Cable.)
FORT LEAVENWORTH, Dec. 27.—
Orders have been received here
from the War Department transfer-
ring Company 1 of the Third Bat-
talion of Engineers, U. S. A., to Ho-
nolulu, Hawaii, and arrangements
are now under way to entrain the
command.

The order comes as a surprise, as
it was the expectation of the officers
and men to be sent to the Philip-
pines for two years of service. The
change to Hawaii is being received
with a great deal of satisfaction.

At present Companies I, K and L
are stationed here, and it is consid-
ered probable that one of the re-
maining companies, after the de-
parture of Company I, may be ordered
to the Philippines to relieve either
Company E or H, now stationed in
these islands, with headquarters in
Manila.

Company G is now at Fort De
Russy, near Honolulu, and the new
order increasing the engineer force
there is taken as an indication that
the work of fortifying the island of
Oahu will be pushed as rapidly as
possible.

PROTECTING NEGRO FROM LYNCHING

WESTON, W. V., Dec. 27.—A com-
pany of West Virginia militia is oc-
cupying the streets of this town in
an effort to save a negro from lyn-
ching by a determined mob of farmers
from this district. The negro is
charged with a criminal assault upon
the daughter of a farmer near here.

To save the life of the wretched
man he has been placed in the re-
ceiving vault of an express com-
pany, where it will be impossible for
a mob to get at him without the use
of heavy charges of dynamite, which
would endanger the building and
surrounding property if used.

SENSATIONAL ARREST OF CITY OFFICIALS

GARY, Ind., Dec. 27.—The mayor,
chief of police and eight officials of
this city have been arrested upon
warrants charging conspiracy. The
charge grows out of the bitter po-
litical fight which has been waged
here for a long time. The specific
charges are based upon an alleged
combination to violate the election
laws during the recent November
election. The accused have given
bail. The arrests caused a sensation
in this part of the State.

WORLD'S RECORD FOR ALTITUDE

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 27.—The
world's record for altitude in a heav-
ier than air machine was broken
here today, when Archibald Hoxsey,
the aviator, reached the height of
11,474 feet at Dominguez Field in a
biplane.

VANCOUVER WINS IN FOOTBALL GAME

VANCOUVER, Dec. 27.—In a
hard-fought intercollegiate match
here today between the Vancouver
University and Stanford University
teams of rugby football players, Van-
couver defeated the Southern team.

MT. AETNA AGAIN IN ERUPTION.

CATANIA, Italy, Dec. 27.—Mt.
Aetna, across the Strait of Messina,
in Sicily, is in eruption, and the pe-
nants are fleeing from the surround-
ing territory. No loss of life has
been reported as yet.

HAWAIIAN MONEY IN ESTIMATES

Washington, Dec. 4.—The estimates
of appropriations for every branch of
the Federal Government in the fiscal
year ending June 30, 1912, aggregat-
ing \$748,414,861, were submitted to
Congress today by Secretary of the
Treasury MacVane. Hawaiian ap-
propriations, include the following:
Dredging power plant, dry-dock and
shops at Pearl Harbor, \$2,287,000;
searchlights harbor defense, \$40,000;
continuing coast defenses, Hawaii,
\$250,000; cavalry post, Oahu, \$175,
000; Hilo harbor, \$250,000; Kahului
harbor, \$150,000; lighting Pearl Har-
bor, \$80,000.
