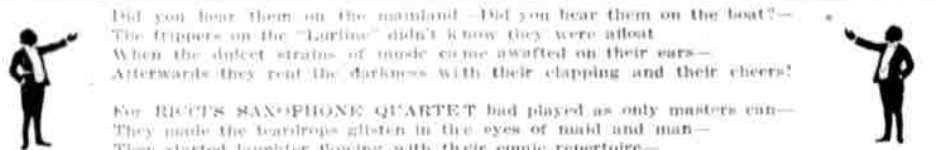


Ricci's Italian Saxophone Quartette

ITALIAN SAXOPHONE QUARTET AT BIJOU

Direct from playing thirty-four weeks in the best theaters of the Pacific coast, Ricci's Italian Saxophone Quartet will make its first Honolulu appearance tonight at the big and comfortable Bijou Theater. ANOTHER VERSION OF THAT DOG INCIDENT

Mrs. George M. Pullman continues to be misrepresented. Here is how the San Francisco Call's Honolulu correspondent gets the story: Honolulu, Apr. 24.—Despite the tears of Mrs. George Pullman, who arrived on the Wilhelmina, her Japanese

poodle will have to undergo a quarantine of 120 days before it can be brought ashore here. On account of the prevalence of rabies at San Francisco no dogs are allowed to land from that port until the necessary period of quarantine has been gone through.

Mrs. Pullman travels with a dog

and a maid, and she maintains that as long as her dog did not mix with those in San Francisco, there is no reason for going into quarantine. Officials of the Territory are obstinate, so it seems likely that the dog, mistress and maid will return to the Coast by the Wilhelmina.
