Columbus St. Charles scored its fifteenth straight victory of the season last Saturday at Red Bird stadium as the Carolians downed Columbus East 7-3 in the Central Ohio summer baseball league's final game.

The win gave the Cards an undefeated season. They had notched the championship the week previous when they downed Columbus North two games, but interest was high in the contest because the Cards were undefeated.

As usual the key to St. Charles' success was good pitching and strong hitting. Jack Batchek, who has done his share of the former, turned slugger last week and blasted a single, triple and home-run. His sixth inning three-bagger hit the left field fence at 368 feet on the first bounce.

Ernie DeMatteis tossed a solid seven innings to the Bengals. He was in trouble only once, when with the bases loaded he struck out the final East batter to end the threat.

The win gave the Cards a 4 1/2 game advantage over Columbus North and East. They tied for second place with 10 and four marks, while Upper Arlington took fourth with a 10-5 performance.

The victory was the 61st as against only six losses compiled by St. Charles over the last five years. The league was organized in 1950. The Cards shared the title with Upper Arlington the first season. Since then they've been sole possessor of the championship.

St. Charles' other unbeaten team, the Babe Ruth leaguers, were all set to go after the city champion ship either Thursday or Friday of this week when they tangle with the West Side Pirates in a two out of three series. The younger Carolians have won nine in a row. Manager Kenny Grimes said plans are underway to have one of the championship games in Red Bird stadium sometime next week.
