MRS. LIEDER GETS CITATION

HUSBAND REPORTED MISSING ON AMERICAN SUBMARINE

Mrs. Shirley Lieder, wife of Anthony Lieder, and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Felden Elbertson of 1020 Southard street, is in receipt of an insignia pin containing three gold stars, along with a citation forwarded in connection with loss of her husband on his ship which has failed to return.

The letter, which contained the citation, was received from C. A. Lockwood, Jr., vice admiral, U. S. Navy. The letter follows: "The Commander Submarine Force, Pacific Fleet, has the honor to award the Submarine Combat Insignia and to comment in absentia, Anthony Lieder, U. S. Navy, for services set forth. "Citation: The U. S. S. Escobar failed to return as scheduled from an offensive war patrol which she was conducting in restricted waters, heavily patrolled by enemy air and surface forces. There is no information as to the number of successful attacks the Escobar made during this patrol. However, she was seen by a sister ship early in this patrol to engage an enemy gunboat in a surface battle. Later she reported herself proceeding to a spot known to be highly productive of enemy targets. These facts coupled with the established reputation of her commanding officer for aggressive and daring operations, indicates that she continued her relentless attacks against the enemy until the time she was reported missing.

"As Motor Machinist's Mate, first class, of the U. S. S. Escobar, Anthony Lieder's performance of duty materially contributed to the success of this submarine against the enemy. The Commander Submarine Force, Pacific Fleet, forwards this commendation in recognition of his excellent performance of duty, which was in keeping with the highest traditions of the naval service."
