### QUALIFICATIONS OF ELECTORS

The following is a true copy of Section 1 of Article 7 of the Constitution of the State, as amended, which fixes

Section 1. In all elections every male inhabitant of this State, being a citizen of the United States, every male abitant residing in this State on the twenty-fourth day of June, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, every male instant residing in this State on the first day of January, eighteen hundred fifty.

Every male inhabitant of foreign birth, who, having resided in this state two years and six months prior to eighth day of November, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, and having declared his intention to become a citizen the United States two years and six months prior to said last named day, and every civilized male inhabitant of ian descent, a native of the United States and not a member of any tribe, shall be an elector and entitled to vote; no one shall be an elector or entitled to vote at any election unless he shall be above the age of 21 years, and resided in this State six months and in the township or ward in which he offers to vote 20 days next preceding the election.

Provided, That in time of war, insurrection or rebellion, no qualified elector in the actual military service of United States, or of this State, or in the army or navy thereof, shall be deprived of his vote by reason of his sence from the township, ward or State in which he resides, and the legislature shall have the power and shall wide the manner in which and the time and place at which such absent electors may vote, and for the canvass is return of their votes to the township or ward election district in which they respectively reside or otherwise.
