3. All parcels must bear the re-turn card of the sender, otherwise they will not be accepted for mailing. 4. It will also be understood that parcel post stamps are not valid for

payment of postage on matter of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd class, nor can any of said classes be accepted at the parcel post rate of postage. Registration of parcels has been discontinued, but instead parcels are insured against loss in an amount
