The glorious nobility of a purely benign purpose and the grand impulses which inculcated the motives, of tranquil—beautiful—abnegation from the magnificence of wealth and station to the solemn vows of poverty and the humble subservience to mercy and charity, are, indeed worthy the hallowed veneration clustering about the shrine of the martyrs of the Cross.
