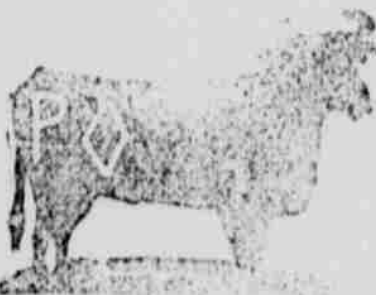

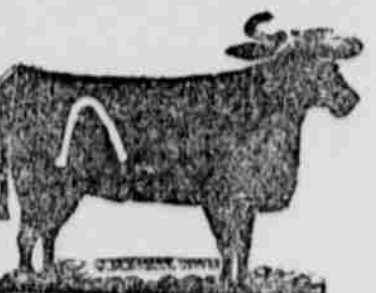
One roan mule, (red roan) 14½ or 15 hands high, branded U S and I C on left shoulder and thigh.

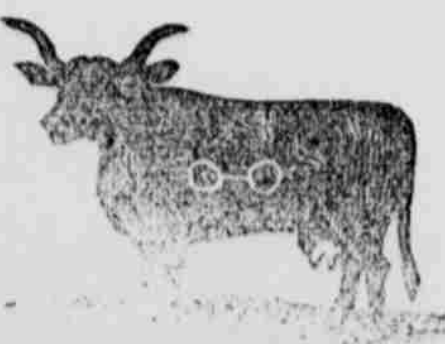

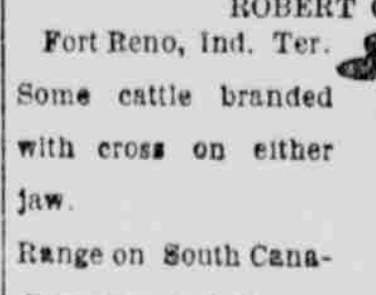

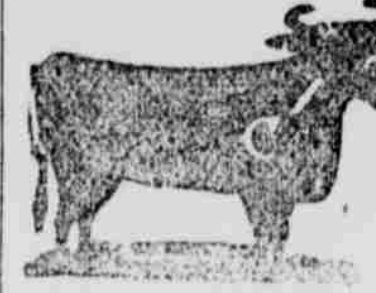
