FIRST DISTRICT.

HILO, PUNA AND HAMAKUA, HAWAII.

6th Precinct. Extending from the bed of the Kaula Gulch to the bed of the Kalopa Gulch (Kulu Gulch). Voting place: Kahohe School House. Inspectors: James Renton, A. Lidgate, Robert Horner.

7th Precinct. Extending from the bed of the Kalopa Gulch to the bed of the Malannah Gulch. Voting place: Honoukaa Court House. Inspectors: F. S. Clinton, Edwin Thomas, E. W. Estep.

8th Precinct. Extending from the bed of the Malannah Gulch to the boundary of Kohala. Voting place: School House, Kukuihaele. Inspectors: Wm. Horner, George Koch, W. A. Yates.

FOURTH DISTRICT.

ALL THAT PORTION OF THE ISLAND OF OAHU LYING EAST AND SOUTH OF NUUANU STREET AND A LINE DRAWN IN EXTENSION THEREOF FROM THE NUUANU PALI TO MOKAPU POINT.

All that portion of Honolulu or Kona, lying mauka of the King street road from the Ewa line to the King street bridge, and all mauka of said road from the Ewa line to the main road up Kalihii valley. 8th Precinct. MR. GREEN'S WORK.

The Agent of the Humane Society and the Good He Does.

Mr. R. I. Green, the agent of the Humane Society, on Saturday, killed one of the horses belonging to Shuman, the hack owner. He also killed a big truck horse belonging to a Chinaman. The horse was crippled, and was about to suffer from glanders. The Chinaman, when he understood the condition of the horse, consented to his death. On Sunday, Mr. Green visited the cattle yards, and found everything in a satisfactory condition. About 125 head of cattle were received from Hawaii, and were in excellent condition.

Yesterday, a sorrel horse, owned by a resident, and suffering from ring bone, was put out of active service, at Mr. Green's request. Serious complaint is made of the condition of the stalls of the Tramways Company. The floors are made of cobble stones, upon which it is difficult for the mules to stand, as many of the stones are pointed and rough. Even a liberal use of straw, would not, it is believed, remedy this trouble.
