For the Gate City. Keeping Winter Appies.

If gathered in October apples should not be put in the cellar, nor in barrels or deep boxes, because in such condition they will pass through a sweat, which ripens them rapidly and causes many of them to rot. I would advise that they be spread on a dry upper foor, say 8 or 10 inches thick, till cool weath. er in November. Then assort and put in boxes or barrels in a cellar. "Old flour barrels should not be used unless well washed BEST QUAL. VIRCINIA MANUPACTURED TORACED. and dried, as the particles of four left in the barrel will mould and impart to the fruit an upplessant flavor. Old lime barrels, it is said, are excellent for this purpose, the lime absorbing the vapor and gases. If this is so, a little freeh slaked lime contered on the bot. tom, sides and top of the barrel would be useful."
