New York, August 18.—The tone of the opening of the stock market was irregular. The usual leaders moved narrowly on small dealings. American Twine rose 2 points and lost half of it, while Anaconda preferred jumped 1. Louisville & Nashville improved 2 1/2, with some light effect elsewhere. Illinois Central gained 1 1/4. Prices declined quite generally below Saturday's close, when the traders sold Brooklyn Rapid Transit and took profits in Louisville & Illinois Central. These stocks fell back a point or more.  
American Express broke 4 1/4. Louisville was rushed up again to the highest before noon, causing the general list to strengthen. Active bond issues were heavy in sympathy with the stock market. Louisville was well sustained, but Rock Island reacted 1 1/4. Pacific Mail rose easily four points.

## HILLMAN AND CHESSMAN WIN IN TENNIS DOUBLES

Helena, August 18.—Fast, snappy play marked the closing of the state tennis tournament Saturday. Hillman and Chessman of Helena won first honors in the state championship doubles, defeating Busch and McLaughlin of Butte. Chessman made some hard smashes and seemed able to place the ball about where pleased and took advantage of every opening left by the Butte men. Hillman was an able second and played a remarkably steady game. McLaughlin and Busch put up a fast game and fought every inch of the game, contesting each point to the bitter end. The former has a remarkably effective serve and uses much the same stroke in returning the ball.  
The first two sets went to the Helena boys by the score 9-7, 6-4. The third was captured by Busch and McLaughlin, in clever style, 6-4. In the fourth set both teams worked hard, the Helena players taking it, 7-5.  
The prize in the consolation singles was taken by Woods of Great Falls by default in the finals.  
The tournament throughout was marked by exceptionally fast playing, and was as a whole very successful. Roy G. Matteson of Great Falls is now the state champion in singles for the year 1902, having defeated George Busch of Butte in the final singles.
