SUMMONS.—IN THE DISTRICT COURT OF

the First judicial district of the state of Montana, in and for the county of Lewis and Clark.

Northwestern Guaranty Loan Company, plaintiff, vs. George H. Leghorn and Frances Leghorn, defendants.

The state of Montana sends greeting to the above named defendants.

You are hereby required to appear in an action brought against you by the above named plaintiff in the district court of the First judicial district of the state of Montana, in and for the county of Lewis and Clark, and to answer the complaint filed therein, within ten days (exclusive of the day of service) after the service on you of this summons, if served within this county, or, if served out of this county, but within this district, within twenty days; otherwise within forty days, or judgment by default will be taken against you according to the prayer of said complaint.

So said action is brought for the purpose of for closing a certain mortgage, made and executed by George H. Leghorn and Frances Leghorn, bearing date upon the 24th day of August, 1890, to secure the payment of a certain promissory note and the renewal notes given in lieu thereof, made and executed by the defendant George H. Leghorn to plaintiff, the last of said notes bearing date upon the 23d day of February, 1892, for the sum of \$1,000, lawful money of the United States, due on the 25th day of August, 1892, together with interest thereon from maturity until paid, devolved in the complaint herein, and which said promissory note is now due and payable, there being due hereon the sum of \$1,050 principal, together with interest thereon from the 25th day of August, 1892, at the rate of ten per cent per annum also for the sum of \$75.00 paid for taxes upon said premises by plaintiff on the 15th day of September, 1892, together with interest thereon from said 15th day of September, 1892, at the rate of ten per cent per annum; and also for the sum of \$150 attorney's fees; and for costs of suit; that the premises conveyed by said mortgage be sold, and the proceeds thereof applied to the payment of said note, moneys expended by plaintiff as aforesaid, and costs of suit.

For further particulars reference to the complaint on file is hereby made, and in case such process does not suffice to pay the same, then to obtain an execution against the said George H. Leghorn for the balance remaining due; and also that said defendants, and all persons claiming by, through or under them, may be barred and foreclosed of all right, title claim, lien, equity of redemption, and interest in and to said mortgaged premises; and for further relief.

And you are hereby notified that if you fail to appear and answer the said complaint, as above required, the said plaintiff will take default against you and apply to the court for the relief demanded in the complaint.
