THE CITY COUNCIL.

MEETING ON FRIDAY NIGHT.

At Quorum a Last, My Boy—No Dada—ing this time.

When we reached the Mayor's office Friday night, everything was proceeding extremely lovely, and although the more pronounced figure of Secretary Mitchell, and the delicate anatomy of the City Attorney, were not, still his Honor shown notably child-like and bland, a fact which we ascribed to the efficient substitution of Messrs. Barksdale and Cochran, in place of the gifted absentees, but which was more particularly due perhaps to the presence of that quorum, which after much suffering and sweating had at last been got together, and although manifestly much astonished at its little peculiarity of being there, it heroically refused to allow this embarrassing frame of mind to operate adversely to its going to work in dead earnest, and dispatching the following business:

Motion of Alderman Swink that Alderman Cochran be appointed Secretary pro tem. Carried. Motion to defer the reading of the law meeting. Carried. Communication of Dr. Janco. Referred to Committee on Hospitals. Memorial to grade Main, Commerce and Elm streets. Referred to Committee on streets.

Petition to include block No. 32 in fire districts. Granted. Account of Judge Taylor as judge of Appeals and judge of elections. Referred to Committee on Claims. Account of Barksdale & Field, amounting to \$1,250 for codifying city ordinances. Read and ordered paid. Account of Barksdale & Field, amounting to \$150 for amending new code ordinances.

Motion to repeal Section 6 and 7 of Chapter 2 of code of ordinances carried. Messrs. Thevenet, Cappy, Austin and Cochran voting in the affirmative; Swink negative. Motion was then made to adjourn, and carried.
