ATTACKED BY INDIANS.—Five Modocs attached a family eight miles from Walla Walla, Oregon. The family retained and the neighbors came to their rescue. Three of the Indians were arrested.

THE MODOC FIGHT.—LAVA BEND, May 13.—Lieut. Camp reports that at sunrise on the 8th inst., the Modocs fired on the pickets of the first company.

Captain Jack rode within one hundred yards of camp, dismounted and charged the camp, firing into the herd and guard.

General Davis is determined to keep moving till the last savages are killed. Two soldiers were wounded mortally.

Captain Jack took his position in the field, in his livery manner, as if he had been Brigadier General.

MONTEGOMERY, Ala., May 13.—Daniel Pratt, the Pioneer manufacturer of Alabama, died at his home in Prattville, fourteen miles from Montgomery, at 1 o'clock this morning.

NEW YORK, May 13.—A special from the Lava Bend says: Captain Habsbrack's scouting party was attacked by the Modocs, being a complete surprise.

The troops captured twenty-five horses. Captain Jack on this occasion wore Gen. Canby's uniform.

When the last courier left, the troops were between the Indians and their Lava stronghold. Captain Habsbrack thinks the Indians are nearly out of ammunition.
