A Remarkable Book.

The London Times contains some remarkable facts as to Bellows' "French and English Dictionary," which must be a curiosity in the world, if it will bear out the "Times" description of it as being "a complete dictionary" of the two languages as has ever been published and all contained in a volume three-quarters of an inch thick, measuring four inches and a quarter by two inches and three-quarters, and weighing only four ounces and a half. Mr. Bellows' is a practical printer of London of great skill and reputation. The type used in the dictionary is of the kind called "Bellotyp," the smallest known in Great Britain, and two sizes smaller than that in which the most minute pocket tests are printed.

From the extraordinary care taken in manufacturing the types it is very clear and plain; but as the "Times" suggests, its diminutive size would make it inconvenient for continued perusal. This dictionary has undergone some vicissitudes, as a great part of the manuscript was in Paris during the siege, and was there exposed to risks from which it escaped unharmed. It is one of the traditions of the printing trade that a Bible in type nearly as small as that of the dictionary, was once printed in Sweden, and that the work blinded some of the compositors engaged upon it.

Mr. Bellows does not tell his readers, but we know from other sources, says the "Times," that before commencing his dictionary he consulted an ophthalmic surgeon with regard to the fitness of his compositors for using types of such a character, and that he obtained for them such magnifying glasses and such an arrangement of light as would permit them to enter upon the undertaking without fear of danger." — [San Diego World.]
