But on those subjects the editor will abstain from making any comments: like modern fabrics affixed to the majestic monuments of antiquity, such additions would injure the general effect of the original matter: Nothing then must be expected in this publication, but the debates of the convention, as they have been daily recollect'd by the late respectable Chief Justice Yates, and copied from his notes by the late chancellor of the state of New York. Mr. John Lansing, his colleague as a delegate to the convention, and both distinguished republicans; To which will be annexed to supply the vacuum occasioned by the departure of those two gentlemen from the convention before its termination, the genuine information delivered to the legislature of the state of Maryland, relative to the proceedings of the federal convention, by Mr. Luther Martin, then attorney general of that state and one of the Delegates in the said convention; an extract of the journal of the convention, containing the various plans of constitution, presented by the several states, and the constitution of the United States, with all the amendments ratified, as at present existing.
