

HE'S BUILT HOUSES 10 TO 12 HOURS A DAY FOR 50 YEARS

Now, at 71, Frank Johnson
Says He'll Go on Doing It
Till He's 100.

MASTER OF 13 TRADES.

Also Studied Law to Save Legal
Fees—Wealthy, but No
Idleness for Him.

Entering his seventy-second year, Frank D. Johnson of No. 1139 East Second Street, Brooklyn, expects to live to be one hundred and work every day from ten to twelve hours at his favorite outdoor sport, which is building houses all by himself and selling them. Mr. Johnson was found today by an Evening World reporter at work on a "one-man" house he is constructing in Gravesend Avenue, near Avenue F. No hands but his have touched the building or the material since it was started, and none but his will touch it until it is completed and put up for sale. He figures he ought to get \$500 for it.

Mr. Johnson has plenty of money. He could have retired years ago and taken up golf or travelling, but he likes to do constructive work in the open air, and to the gratification of this liking he attributes his robust health and energy at the age of seventy-one.

He has all his original teeth but two, which were extracted years ago. His iron gray hair is thick and plentiful and his whiskers are neatly trimmed. He gets many a laugh out of life and even an experience such as being struck by lightning doesn't discomfort him. On July 15 last, while he was working on the second floor of the Gravesend Avenue house, lightning struck it and knocked it flat. He dug himself out of the ruins, went home, put arnica on his bruises and the next morning he was back on the job rebuilding the demolished structure.

Mr. Johnson was born in Boston of a family that dates back to the Revolutionary War. He came to Brooklyn in 1865 and since 1869 has been in the building business. He is a practical stonemason, bricklayer, carpenter, plasterer, plumber, tin-smith, painter, paper hanger, decorator, glazier, electrician, wood carver

Run as Druggist Defies Revolver
and Shoots for Police—
Two Arrested.

Drifman's hands went up when he saw one of the bandits point a revolver. As the second started going through his pockets the druggist changed his mind about submitting and shouted for help.

Policemen Liles and Feldman of the Gates Avenue Station responded, and after a chase arrested two youths who described themselves as Joseph Chisano, nineteen, No. 2 St. Felix Street, and Michael Callery, twenty-one, No. 22 North Eleventh Place. The police say Chisano had a loaded revolver. The youths had got nothing from their victim.

Polish-Lithuanian Dispute Settled.
CHENNAI, Sept. 1 (Associated Press).—The dispute between Poland and Lithuania regarding Vilna was settled by the representatives of the two countries here this morning. They agreed that there should be two Lithuanians, one the District of Kovno, which should be independent, and the other Vilna, in which the Poles will supervise the administration.

DENIES ARLISS IS ILL.

Winthrop Ames Says Electric Wire
Prevented Performances.
