

# BOMBING PLANES AND MACHINE GUNS HUNT MOONSHINERS

Poses Fail in All Night  
Search for Slayers of  
Revenue Men.

MOUNT STERLING, Ky., Dec. 12.—Poses at dawn to-day had failed to capture the three alleged moonshiners who killed Prohibition Agents Robert Duff and Dave Treadway from ambush Saturday and Sunday in Menifee County's bootleg war.

All night the poses of Federal, State and county authorities searched the brush of "Moonshine Valley." Several times machine guns were set in readiness to rout the defenders, but not a shot was fired.

Members of the man hunting party returning here to-day said they had not given up hope. The hunt will continue.

COVINGTON, Ky., Dec. 12.—Preparations to mass 500 Prohibition agents equipped with bombing planes and machine guns, for an onslaught on the mountain stronghold of "Bob" Ballard's band of Menifee County moonshiners, are being made by Federal authorities.

Three officers, Elmer Correll, James Wood and W. C. Huddleston, who are back from the scene, said the War Department would be appealed to for two bombing planes and a number of machine guns, saying that only by bombing the entire mountain would it be possible to drive the moonshiners from the caves and natural barricades afforded in the wild section of the State.

Belief that moonshiners from other districts were constantly reinforcing those entrenched in the State Creek section was expressed by Correll.

WIDOW HIS ONLY MOURNER.  
CAMDEN, N. J., Dec. 12.—His widow was the sole mourner at the funeral to-day of Dr. Joel W. Ethlan, who was a physician here for more than thirty years. In compliance with a note written shortly before his death there were no flowers or services. Burial took place at Greenwich, N. J. He stipulated his widow should be the only mourner.

## CLERGYMAN TO MARRY WOMAN WHO WAS HIS HOUSEKEEPER 25 YEARS

Rev. Kidder of New Canaan,  
Brother of Reputed Inventor of  
Noiseless Typewriter.

The Rev. Benjamin F. Kidder, sixty-six, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church at New Canaan, Conn., and Miss Matilda J. J. Kelley, sixty, his housekeeper for twenty-five years, yesterday came to New York City and obtained a license to marry Dec. 20. Mr. Kidder is a widower and a brother of the man credited with the invention of the noiseless typewriter. He has two sons living, Raymond Kidder of Brooklyn and Harry Kidder of Stratford, Conn. His eldest son, Frank, died a month ago.

News of the prospective wedding was received yesterday by many of Mr. Kidder's church members. Some said it would be a fitting reward to Miss Kelley, who for a quarter of a century has devoted her energies to the Kidder household.

Mrs. Kidder died three years ago. Mr. Kidder became ill recently and his life was despaired of. Many said that the devoted ministrations of Miss Kelley aided largely in his recovery.

## REPORT ASKS DISMISSAL.

License Inspector Charged With  
Falsification.

In a report to the Mayor, made public yesterday, Commissioner of Accounts David Hirschfeld accuses John E. Egan, an inspector in the Bureau of Licenses, with complicity in the falsification of a taxicab chauffeur's license. The Commissioner accuses John's brother, Tom Egan, of No. 103 West 42d Street, of having committed the falsification and of having taken a \$50 bribe for so doing.

John Egan's dismissal has been recommended and Commissioner Hirschfeld has caused a copy of the record taken upon inquiry into the case to be sent to District Attorney Banton.

## KIDNAPPED BY FOUR MEN.

Mrs. Hutchins, Missing 2 Months,  
Had Just Returned Home.

Kidnapped on her doorstep as she was returning from an unexplained absence of two months, during which her family and police tried to find her, Mrs. Anna Hutchins, twenty-eight, of No. 492 14th Avenue, Irvington, N. J., was overpowered by four men yesterday and carried off in an automobile.

Mrs. Ida Sornson saw her daughter crossing the street yesterday and went to the door to welcome her. As Mrs. Hutchins climbed the stairs, the four men seized her. In 1912 she was shot five times by her husband, James C. Hutchins, of Montclair, N. J., and nearly died. He killed himself.

## LEFT SHERIFF KIDDIES SO HE'D FREE HUBBY

Woman Forces Alleged Bootleg's  
Release in Unique Way.

STREUBENVILLE, Ohio, Dec. 12.—Mrs. John Borram of Tiltonville, Ohio, obtained the release of her husband from jail on a bootlegging charge in a unique manner. On Saturday she appealed to Sheriff Edward Lucas for her husband's release, declaring she needed his help in supporting her five children. When Sheriff Lucas refused to free the man Mrs. Borram left her five children in his care and disappeared.

County officials announced yesterday that Borram would be released and sent home to care for the five children. Mrs. Borram has not yet been found.
