ANOTHER ACTOR VICTIM OF SMALLPOX.
Pittsburg, Nov. 24.—Another case of smallpox developed to-day among the members of the Williams & Walker Company, which is presenting "The Boy of Ham" at the Bijou Theatre. The victim is Frank Sutton. To-night the house was closed. The company will disband, but will not be allowed to leave the city. The theatre will be thoroughly fumigated and every measure will be taken to prevent the Pittsburg health authorities to be further contamination. Decisive action in the matter was taken by the Health Board this afternoon as soon as the first case was reported. The company is billed to open at Canton, Ohio, on next Monday night, but all dates have been cancelled. It is possible that the players will be quarantined in Pittsburg.
