

## ARMY AND NAVY NOTES

Battleships in Mimic Warfare at Guantanamo.

Washington, February 6.—ATLANTIC FLEET'S ACTIVITIES.—A wireless message from Rear Admiral Seaton Schroeder, commanding the Atlantic fleet at Guantanamo, shows that the vessels were very active last week simulating battle conditions. The ships have been divided into two divisions, the red and the blue forces, going out early every morning for evolutions and returning to anchor in the afternoon. Rear Admiral Schroeder and his division commanders have been alternating in command of the two forces.

The latter part of the week was given up to the fleet regatta, after the ships had returned to their anchorage each afternoon. The victors in the contest were the Kansas crew, which won the Jamestown cup, the Belmont cup and the Drexel cup; the Mississippi crew, which won the Havana cup, the San Pedro cup, the Dungeness cup and the Pensacola cup; the Georgia crew, which won the Battenberg cup, and the Louisiana crew, which won the Dungeness cup.

The second division of the fleet ran over to Samana Bay, Santo Domingo, Saturday night for torpedo exercises and was attacked by a division of torpedo boats. The result of the attack is not yet known.

On Friday the entire fleet had torpedo defense searchlight exercises. There were boating and swimming every day, and 44 sailors qualified in swimming.

**THE MARIETTA SENT TO PORTSMOUTH.**—After a conference to-day between Rear Admiral Wainwright, adm for operations, and Surgeon General Stokes, it was decided that the gunboat Marietta should be sent to her home port at Portsmouth, N. H. The vessel is lying in quarantine at Key West, and although the medical officers are confident that there has been no yellow fever aboard the ship, as an extra measure of caution she will be sent above the frost line, where the disease germs and mosquitoes will surely be eliminated if any remain.

The only death from fever that occurred aboard the Marietta, that of J. H. Minor, coxswain, is declared by the naval surgeon to have resulted from an attack of pernicious malaria. No apprehension is felt for the crew of the Tacoma, which remains on the Honduran coast, nor for the crew of the Wheeling, which recently arrived there.

**DECLINED COMMISSION.**—Although confirmed by the Senate as a second Lieutenant in the Infantry branch of the army, Everett M. Balcom, of New Hampshire, will decline to accept the appointment, because of the discovery that he had been discharged from the coast artillery corps, having failed to pass two successive examinations for promotion. As required by law, he was discharged honorably and given a year's pay.
