800 American Tourists Reach Here on Potsdam from War Zone.

With more than eight hundred passengers on board the Potsdam, of the Holland America Line, arrived here yesterday, one day overdue. The refugees brought stories of anxious hours, some cases hardships, in their efforts to reach a port of safety and obtain passage home. The Potsdam

obtain passage home. The Potsdam did not sight a vessel after leaving the English Channel until she arrived off the Long Island shore.

Many of the passengers arrived with nothing more than their hand baggage, and few had any money left. Among the passengers was Julius P. Meyer, first vice-president of the Hamburg-American Line. He had intended to return to his duties here on the Imperator, but, like many other passengers on the Potsdam, he was forced to make other arrangements when the German government took over the
