



The Fruits of "Watchful Waiting" in Mexico

These photographs of the massacre of eighteen American mining men by Villa soldiers on January 11, three hours' ride from Chihuahua City, are published as evidence of the value placed on American life and American citizenship in Mexico. These stripped, mutilated dead bodies bring home as no word of mouth or pen can, the utter contempt and scorn in which the government and nation of the United States are held in Mexico.

The photographs show how the murderers left the bodies. The lower left hand picture is of the funeral in El Paso of two of the victims, Maurice Anderson and E. R. Robinson.

Dead men tell no tales, says the proverb. But, though silent, these ask a question. It is: "Who is responsible?"
