

RAND WILL PROBE SWANN'S OFFICE
Jerome's Law Partner Named as Adviser to Extraordinary Grand Jury.

LOBBY HINT FAILS TO HALT ARMY BILL
Amendment in House Provides for Separate Corps for Construction.

WIDE INQUIRY PLANNED
Investigation Expected to Include Others Beside Kilroe, Dooling and Smith.

DOUBLES PRESENT FORCE
Representatives See Hand of Contractors in Change in Committee Measure.

William Rand, whose experience as a legal practitioner includes a bit as a colonel in the Judge Advocate-General's Department during the war, was appointed yesterday a Special Deputy Attorney-General for the purpose of acting as an adviser to the Extraordinary Grand Jury in its further investigation of the deaths of three members of the official staff of District Attorney Swann.

WASHINGTON, March 12.—Existence of an "organized lobby of contractors" aided by interested army officers with the motive of amending the army reorganization bill so as to provide a separate construction corps, was charged in the House today by Representatives Madden (Ill.), Anthony (Kan.), Knutson (Minn.) and Wood (Ind.), all Republicans.

There was some intimation that this bill may lead the Extraordinary Grand Jury away from the Criminal Court Building and into quarters in an uptown hotel. This is due to the fact that members of the panel are said to fear "leakage" if they conduct their inquiry in the building that is accepted by the District Attorney.

Representative Harrison (Va.), Democrat, a supporter of the proposed amendment, replied last night that "as much lobbying on one side as on the other." Other supporters declared that continuation of the corps as it existed during the war would result in great savings.

It was also said on good authority that the grand jurors intend to extend their inquiry if the facts uncovered before them warrant its extension, and that they may direct it at other Assistant District Attorneys than Edwin P. Kilroe, John H. Dooling and James H. Smith.

The House later reaffirmed its action by voting 77 to 47 to discharge the Quartermaster Corps from such duties and to transfer from the Quartermaster branch the officers and men necessary to fill the places created in the construction service.

While Mr. Rand declined to make any comment upon his appointment, he stated that he would be prepared to issue a statement this morning at 11 o'clock.

Representative Anthony again attacked the creation of the separate service, claiming that it would cost more than \$4,300,000 more were in the corps the amendment as adopted provided for 8,000 men.

Raymond P. Almiral, former of the Grand Jury, expressed himself as might pleased with Mr. Swann's acceptance of the post, and said the appointment met with the approval of all of the members of the panel.

DEMAND LOWER GRADE GAS.
Companies Claim Present Standard is Too Costly.

The association declares that the present law requiring a standard gas of twenty-two candle power in New York City is responsible for the annual waste of millions of gallons of gas, with no substantial benefit to the consumer. A suggested reform is a change to the 38 British thermal unit standard of Massachusetts.
