PRUSSIA.

Ways for the Result of the Annexation Policy.

Bozen, Sept. 7—Evening.

The Prussian Chamber of Deputies has passed the bill for the annexation of Hanover, Hesse, Nassau and the city of Frankfurt.

A bill for the annexation of Schleswig and Holstein has been sent in by Count Bismarck.

The German Gazette and the Belgian press are hostile to these movements, and ways for the future are entered.

ENGLAND.

Resignation of Earl Cowley as British Minister in Paris.

BY STEAMSHIP TO AUGUST 30.

The Inman steamship City of Boston, Captain Brooks, which left Liverpool at half-past twelve (noon) on the 29th and Queenstown on the 30th of August, arrived at this port at half past eleven P. M. yesterday.

PRUSSIAN ANNEXATION.

Count Bismarck Makes Another Explanation to the Legislature—His Opinion of a Congress.

A despatch from Berlin, of the 27th of August, says: At the sitting of the committee of the Lower Chamber on the Annexation Bill yesterday Count von Bismarck made the following remarks upon the course it was essential for Prussia to pursue:

The union of the country in question with Prussia could not be independent upon the Parliament. It was still uncertain how many weeks or months might elapse until Parliament met. Any delay in the incorporation would only lead to the notion that the arrangements were not settled, and insecurity would result. Such a course might also bring a difference upon the part of the government which Europe could easily turn to account. Moreover the Parliaments would not be competent to pass any such resolution. Should we subsequently break out the ultimate approval of the Parliament would be of no use to the government, and it might very well happen that, after the incorporation Prussia would be compelled to defend her possession against foreign Powers, as had been the case with Siberia in the previous century. No doubt would be denied to us if we were to defend ourselves as fully determined and able to defend the incorporation when once ordered and carried out.

An European congress of which Deputy Dr. Vierling has spoken would be nothing further; it would be sufficient to meet in Berlin. The government has the right to do what it pleases, whatever it may be, and it need not be done in accordance with the law of nations or with the principles of justice and humanity. The law of nations does not bind us to anything, and the principles of justice and humanity do not bind us to anything.

Deputy Rothenberg demands that the Prussian constitution should be definitely introduced into all the incorporated countries by the 1st of October, 1867; but I am unable to accept this proposal without the assent of the people. I have no objection to take it up, and to withdraw the bill.

The amounts of other deputies are far from conclusive. The incorporation of the country is not to be effected by the introduction of the Prussian constitution. It is to be effected by the introduction of the Prussian army.

Deputy Rothenberg demands that the Prussian army should be introduced into the incorporated countries by decree; but such a measure is difficult to imagine. I will see by this short summary of the article of M. Cochet that I had good reason for requiring that the French government could not withdraw the subsidies to the Mexican forces, and that that it was to its interest to do so.
