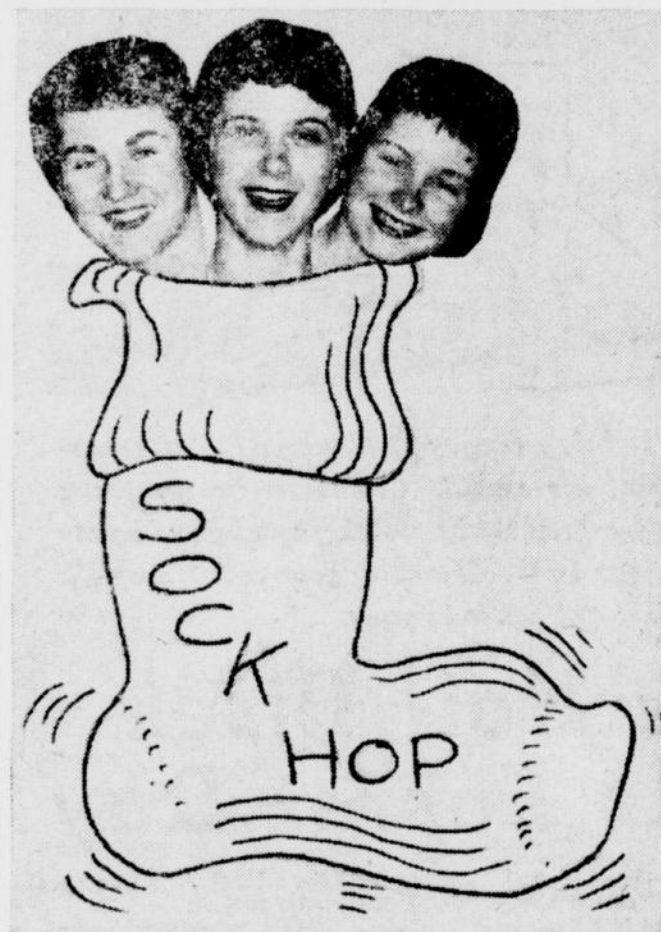

Foot Notes!

Why Don't They Make a Shoe That Will Elongate When Baby's Feet Grow?
